It has come to my attention that the Chestnut Ridge Eruv Association has installed an eruv along utility poles in the Township of Mahwah. In reviewing the Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Mahwah, same is impermissible as the installation of an eruv would constitute a sign on a utility pole.

I direct your attention to the following section of the Township of Mahwah Zoning Ordinance, which defines a sign as follows: "Sign shall mean any device for visual communication that is used for the purpose of bringing the subject thereof to the attention of the public". (Section 24-2.2). Further, the Township Zoning Ordinance specifically prohibits the following signs within all zones in the Township: "Signs placed on trees, rocks or utility poles". (Section 24-6.8F3).

In reviewing the ordinance, the installation of an error constitutes a prohibited activity and is therefore violative of the ordinance sections mentioned herein. Please take the appropriate steps to remove the error that has been presently installed and cease further installation of same.

Normally, O&R does not allow anyone to place anything on the poles without permission. Not only does the BPU obligated to allow these ERUV markings, Orange and Rockland has an obligation to comply because of several Federal Law suits.

But they have NO OBLIGATION to notify the municipality. The most recent litigation was in Tenafly NJ. http://www2.ca3.uscourts.gov/opinarch/013301.txt

These markings connect Saddle River Road and East Mahwah road, by way of Airmont, Airmont, Masonicus, Sparrowbush and a left hand turn onto Saddle River Road.

The ERUV is not complete until the perimeter is complete. The municipalities both Mahwah and Upper Saddle River did not receive any notice, or could O&R deny the application.

Good evening Mayor Laforet,

I hope this email finds you well. I am reaching out to you about an issue that is extremely heartbreaking to me as a lifelong Mahwah resident. I am apologizing in advance for the very lengthy email, however, this is a topic that is very near and clear to me. Recently, through social media I became aware of the installation ERUV on the township utility poles. As someone who grew up in Mahwah and recently just purchased my first home in Mahwah; it is exceedingly disheartening that something like this was done without anyone's knowledge. From

my understanding, please correct me if I am wrong, the 1/2 inch PVC piping "symbolically extends the private domain of Jewish households into public areas, permitting activities within it that are normally forbidden in public on the Sabbath". To me, this sounds like the end to the Mahwah that I grew up in and loved and the beginning of Mahwah turning into Rockland County and all of the corruption.

After driving around some of Mahwah near me I noticed many poles with ERUV on them, and could not help but think, "How did no one see this?". Jewish Enclosure Sparks Controversy

MAHWAH, N.J. – The installation of a ritual enclosure called an eruv in Mahwah has sparked an online petition with about 270 signers who are worried about "illegal incursions" in the community.

The eruv's perimeter is being marked by half-inch thick PVC piping on some utility poles in Mahwah and Upper Saddle River. Eruvs permit observant Jews, such as ultra-Orthodox Jews, to carry Items on Shabbat, a day where all activities associated with work are prohibited for some.

The piping has been installed on utility poles on Saddle River Road, East Mahwah Road, Airmont Avenue, Masonicus Road and Sparrowbush Road.

"I live in this town and don't want to see it be destroyed like areas in Rockland. Also the school district needs to be protected," wrote one signer of the "Protect the Quality of Our Community in Mahwah" petition.

Some towns in Rockland County have had issues with eroding school systems and tax bases.

The petition states: "Rockland Electric, without notification to Mahwah residents, permitted the use of public utility poles in our Township for the attachment of a religious article/symbol called an eruv used by the Hasidic sect. We must demand the removal of these eruvs in order to prevent further illegal incursions into our community."

A Facebook group entitled "Mahwah Strong" was also created this week for residents to "voice their concerns over the installation of an Eruv and the impact it could have on our community," according to its description.

The group had more than 1,700 members by Thursday evening and is "getting the knowledge out to the community to make sure everyone knows what's going on," Brett Coplin, one of the group's administrators, told Daily Voice.

"This is not a religious thing ... This isn't an attack on Hasidies. This isn't an attack on ultra-Orthodox. This is protecting

our town from a group of people that have historically come into towns and taken over," he said. "This is not anything new. A lot of us believe ... that constructing this eruy coming through our town is the first step for that."

Mahwah Mayor Bill Laforet said the township was not notified that the pipes were being installed, and the state Board of Public Utilities (BPU) granted permission for the pipes to be put on Orange and Rockland utility poles. He also said that because of federal lawsuits, the BPU and the utility company are obligated to allow the eruy markings.

"The administration believes that there are ways to prevent this from happening, and we are exploring every option to address this issue," Laforet said.

Hi Mayor,

I wanted to bring to your attention an important point that may have been missed in the social-media-induced mass hysteria.

I believe that the public outcry on Facebook and in the media have done a terrible disservice to Mahwah. The Township is on the verge of being irrevocably tarnished by this public controversy that will be taken into account by prospective home buyers who will think twice about moving to a town embroiled in what seems to be a struggle for its life with signs, facebook pages, media coverage, public meetings etc.. To an outsider, a mere 48 hours of media hysterics, now makes Mahwah appear equivalent to communities like Monroe, Pomona etc. where no one will move to because of the perceived 'takeover' of the towns. This has happened for one reason: people who thought and still think they are doing a service to the town have whipped the masses into a frenzy creating a mob-like mentality which follows whoever screams louder. To top that, how many residents have quietly begun thinking of an early exit strategy so that they can get out while the going is good? 

While there seems to be much discussion on the ERUV's there are certain issues and timelines that I want to provide:

- * The Township was made aware of the installation of ERUV's on Rockland Electric poles via e-mail on May 10th 2017. Rockland Electric provided a list of poles in the Township that would have the ERUV's placed on them including the pole number and location.
- * Rockland Electric stated the ERUV's would be installed through a Joint Use agreement process and provided us with the name of the Orange and Rockland Joint Use Facilitator. Nothing was brought to the attention of the Police Department that the Township objected to the installation of the ERUV's after the e-mail was received.
- * We were contacted by a vendor who requested an officer for traffic control for the installation of ERUV's in the Township. All the required protocols were followed in order to receive approval for the vendor. This included approval by the McCarthy Forde for appropriate insurance, and a signed contract. We subsequently worked for the approved vendor at the rate set by Ordinance and the Township was reimbursed for officer services.
- *On May 3rd, 2017 an Officer stopped a suspicious utility bucket truck near the intersection of Airmont Avenue and Airmount Road for a motor vehicle violation. The individual was installing ERUV's on utility poles and stated he had permission from Orange and Rockland and produced documentation from Orange & Rockland. Captain Blank was advised of this and made a call to Orange and Rockland and confirmed that permission had been given to install ERUV's.
- * The hiring of the Officer for traffic control was handled in a manner consistent was any other traffic detail that we are requested for. The Township had been aware of the installation of the ERUV's on O&R utility poles for approximately one month prior to an Officer being requested for traffic. Appearance wise the ERUV is not significantly different from other conduit pipe installed on O&R poles.

Hi Mayor,

I wanted to bring to your attention an important point that may have been missed in the social-media-induced mass hysteria.

I believe that the public outcry on Facebook and in the media have done a terrible disservice to Mahwah. The Township is on the verge of being irrevocably tarnished by this public controversy that will be taken into account by prospective home buyers who will think twice about moving to a town embroiled in what seems to be a struggle for its life with signs, facebook pages, media coverage, public meetings etc.. To an outsider, a mere 48 hours of media hysterics, now makes Mahwah appear equivalent to communities like Monroe, Pomona etc. where no one will move to because of the perceived 'takeover' of the towns. Dear Mr. Brizzolara:

As you are aware, the undersigned is the attorney for the Borough of Upper Saddle River. In furtherance of my telephone conversation with you yesterday, I am advising you that the Borough requires the removal of the devices and strips placed on poles owned and maintained by Orange & Rockland Utilities, Inc. ("O&R") on certain streets within the Borough of Upper Saddle River, which are intended to denote the boundaries of an eruy.

Enclosed herewith is a copy of Ordinance No. 16-15 which is part of the Streets and Sidewalks Ordinance. Your attention is directed to Section 1 of the Ordinance, §122-17G, which prohibits the placement of items on public utility poles, except as may be authorized or required by law. It is the Borough's position that this Ordinance prohibits the placement of devices and materials which have been located on O&R's poles which are intended to denote an eruy.

In addition, applicable statutes would require municipal approval for the use by another party of utility poles within Borough rights-of-way. More particularly, N.J.S.A. 48:3-19 expressly requires the consent of a municipality when a party seeks to use utility poles owned by another. Furthermore, N.J.S.A. 48:17-10 prohibits the placement of or construction of any pole, conduit, wire or fixture on or upon any public road without approval of the governing body of the municipality except as to lines maintained by telegraph or telephone companies.

From the foregoing, it is clear that O&R has failed to adhere to local Ordinance, nor has it sought the necessary approvals as required by State statute. For these reasons, the Borough hereby directs that the devices and materials placed on the utility poles be immediately removed. Failure to comply with this directive will result in the Borough pursuing all available remedies to secure the removal of these devices and fixtures.

I would suggest that O&R be guided accordingly.

ORDINANCE #16-15

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 122 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF UPPER SADDLE RIVER ENTITLED, "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS".

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, in the County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1.

Chapter 122 of the Code of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, Streets and Sidewalks, Article III, Borough Road Regulations, §122-17, Unlawful Acts, be and is hereby amended to add the following paragraph:

"G. Post or affix any sign, advertisement, notice, poster, paper, device, or other matter to any public utility pole, shade tree, lamp post, curbstone, sidewalk, or upon any public structure or building, except as may be authorized or required by law."

Section 2. Fines and Penalties.

For violation of any provision of this Ordinance, the fines and penalties shall be in accordance with §1-15 of the Borough Code.

Section 3. Severability.

If any section, sentence or any other part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not effect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance but shall be confined in its effect to the section, sentence or other pat of this Ordinance directly involved in the

controversy which such judgment shall be rendered.

Section 4. Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed.

All ordinances or parts or ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect after publication thereof and final passage as required by law.




