DECLARATION OF THEODORE PREUSCH

- I, Theodore Preusch, declare under penalty of perjury:
- 1. I am an employee of the Borough of Upper Saddle River (USR).
- I currently serve as the Borough Administrator and have for approximately 11 years.
- Before I became the Borough Administrator, I served as 3. a police officer for the USR's Police Department (USR PD) for 35 years.

4. Of those 35 years, I had the honor of serving as the Chief of Police for 25 years.

HISTORY OF USR'S PROHIBITION OF POSTING SIGNS AND DEVICES TO UTILITY POLES

- 5. I have both personal and institutional knowledge with respect to USR's enforcement of its policy and code provisions prohibiting the placement and installation of unauthorized signs and devices on utility poles within USR ("the Sign Ordinances").
- 6. Contrary to Plaintiffs' unfounded allegations, USR has consistently and uniformly enforced its Sign Ordinances and has done so without regard to the content of the signs or devices at issue.
- 7. Such Sign Ordinances have existed within the USR Code since at least 1994.
- 8. On or about November 9, 1994, the USR Code was amended to provide "no sign shall be attached to a tree, pole, building or structure." See attached as Exhibit "A" is a true and correct copy of Ordinance 17-94, amending USR Code §150-21, prohibiting signs from being attached to poles (emphasis added).
- 9. Since November 4, 1985, the USR Code has defined a sign as "[a]ny inscription written, printed, painted or otherwise placed on a board, plate, banner or upon any material object or any device whatsoever which, by reason of its form, color, wording, activity or technique or otherwise, attracts attention to itself,

used as a means of identification, advertisement or announcement. As used in this chapter, the term shall apply only to such signs as are visible to persons located outdoors." See attached as **Exhibit "B"** is a true and correct copy of USR Code §150-3 defining the term sign.

- 10. To date, USR Code §150-21 prohibits the attaching of signs to utility poles.
- 11. On December 13, 1995, USR continued its regulation of utility poles when it passed Ordinance 19-95, revising USR Code §76-46, which states that "[n]o signs shall be permitted to be posted on such structures as telephone poles, street signs, trees or fences." See attached as Exhibit "C" is a true and correct copy of Ordinance 19-95, revising USR Code §76-46, prohibiting signs from being attached to utility poles.
- 12. USR Code §76-46 specifically prohibits garage sale signs from being attached to utility poles. Id.
- 13. In 2014, USR had a particularly challenging election year, during which there was a proliferation of political signs being attached to utility poles, street signs, and other stationary items.
- 14. In 2014, the administration, mayor, and council all knew of the recent proliferation of signage around USR, even as early as mid-summer, and perceived it to be a problem. The proliferation of signs was largely propelled by controversies regarding a

referendum to rezone a large tract in USR that some believed could be used to meet USR's fair housing obligations. Political signs were continually posted on public property despite the best efforts of Borough Police to remove them. They were also routinely removed to enforce USR's Sign Ordinances.

- 15. Following the contentious 2014 election season, a council person inquired of me whether there was anything USR could do to more effectively limit signage on USR's utility poles during election season. Accordingly, I researched the ordinances of other municipalities that might avoid a recurrence of the 2014 election year when so many signs were posted and the police force and local officials were required to act to remove the many signs pursuant to local law. I worked with Borough Attorney Robert T. Regan. Counsel Regan and I eventually looked at various potential ordinances and ultimately agreed that the current Montvale ordinance would be a potential fit.
- 16. However, the effort to pass such legislation got sidetracked due to other more pressing issues and was not revisited for almost a year.
- 17. In late summer of 2015, anticipating an active 2015 election season and recalling the difficulties faced in 2014, the USR Borough Council and the Borough Attorney worked to update the Sign Ordinances via Ordinance 16-15. See attached as Exhibit "D"

is a true and correct copy of Ordinance 16-15 prohibiting posting of unauthorized signs and devices on utility poles.

18. Believing the current ordinances did not sufficiently address the mayor and council's concerns, the revised sign ordinance was at least an occasional source of discussion and research through late 2014 and 2015.

THERE WAS NO DISCUSSION OF THE SIGN ORDINANCE IN RELATION TO THE ERUV

- 19. Although the minutes of the August 18, 2015 closed session of the Borough Council, reflect a discussion of a license agreement between the Vaad haEruv and Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. (O & R), the local electric utility company that owns some utility poles in USR, and the minutes of the closed meeting of the Borough Council on September 3, 2015, reflect a statement by Borough Counsel Regan that the proposed sign ordinance would be brought to the regular meeting for a first reading, there was absolutely no connection between these two items.
- 20. To my knowledge, the topics of lechis and eruvin were never discussed in connection with Ordinance 16-15.
- 21. The first time I heard anything about a proposed eruv extension into USR was around August 10, 2015, during one of my regular consultations with Mayor Joanne Minichetti. The mayor informed me she had heard about an alleged application made to 0 & R for the purpose of placing lechis on utility poles within USR.

She asked that I inquire with O & R about it, and I did so. See attached as **Exhibit "E"** is a true and correct copy of an email chain by and between Michelle Damiani, of O & R, and myself with respect to the placing of an eruy on utility poles in USR.

- 22. Ms. Damiani failed to respond to the substance of my inquiry and instead forwarded my inquiry to the O & R Joint Use Department. Id. I do not recall anyone from the O & R Joint Use Department responding to my email.
- 23. What little knowledge the Mayor had about a proposed eruv and my follow-up with Michele Damiani were discussed very briefly and matter-of-factly at the executive session of the Mayor and Council and reflected in the August 18, 2015, meeting minutes in reference to the license agreement being reached between Vaad haEruv and O & R.
- 24. It was not until June 12, 2017 that O & R responded substantively to my August 10, 2015 inquiry, when Ms. Damiani emailed Police Chief Patrick Rotella to inform him that the Vaad haEruv had been granted a license to place lechis on utility poles to create an eruv in USR. Id.; see also attached as Exhibit "F" is a true and correct copy of an email from Michelle Damiani to Chief Patrick Rotella, dated June 12, 2017 at 4:30 PM, explaining, for the first time, the O & R "license" and the eruv generally.
- 25. I do not recall when or if I reported back to the Mayor and Council that Ms. Damiani had failed to respond to my 2015

inquiry; however, I recall that among the Mayor and Council, there was no further substantive discussion concerning the eruv issue at that time, as the Vaad haEruv and O & R never followed through to discuss the eruv further with us.

- 26. The first reading of Ordinance 16-15 occurred at the September 3, 2015 regular meeting of the Mayor and Council. See attached as Exhibit "G" is a true and correct copy of the minutes from the September 3, 2015 regular meeting of the Mayor and Council evidencing the first reading of Ordinance 16-15.
- 27. Despite diligence by the USR PD to remove signs on public property, the proliferation of signs on utility poles reached such a point during the 2015 election season that 0 & R complained about the number of political signs affixed to its utility poles. See attached as Exhibit "H" is a true and correct copy of an email, dated September 29, 2015, from Neil Winter forwarding a message from 0 & R about its longstanding policy of prohibiting the posting of signs on utility poles-- stating that "staples, tacks or nails... present a potential hazard to 0 & R employees working on the poles" among several other reasons signs should not be placed on poles.
- 28. The request from O & R concerning political signs was received between the first and second reading of this Ordinance.

 Id.
- 29. At the October 1, 2015 regular meeting of the Mayor and Council, Ordinance 16-15 was introduced for public comment;

however, no public comment was made in response to the introduction of the ordinance. See attached as **Exhibit "I"** is a true and correct copy of the minutes from the October 1, 2015 regular meeting of the Mayor and Council reflecting that no public comment was given in response to the introduction of Ordinance 16-15.

- 30. To my knowledge, no one connected with the eruv introduced public comments or contacted the administration or the Mayor and Council to discuss, suggest amendments to, or stake out a position with regard to this ordinance. Nor do I recall any member of the public raising any issues with respect to the ordinance.
- 31. To my knowledge, I was present during almost all, if not all, conversations about this ordinance between the Mayor and Council. I recall absolutely no conversations or communications involving the Mayor and Council even remotely suggesting that the purpose of this ordinance was to subvert or prevent the creation of an eruv.
- 32. Ordinance 16-15 unanimously passed and was then codified as USR Code §122-17G. See attached as **Exhibit "J"** is a true and correct copy of USR Code §122-17G prohibiting the posting of unauthorized signs and devices on utility poles.

USR'S REGULATION OF SIGNS

- 33. USR has consistently regulated signs from a wide variety of sources within its jurisdiction and has done so without regard to the content of the signs.
- 34. For example, on July 6, 2007, USR issued a violation to Remdco, LLC for an alleged violation of USR Code §150-21A. See attached as Exhibit "K" is a true and correct copy of a case disposition information form regarding Complaint Number SC-2007-9040, which alleged a violation of USR Code §150-21A against Remdco, LLC.
- 35. On May 18, 2010, via complaint numbers SC-2010-9990, SC-2010-10021, SC-2010-10022, and SC-2010-10026, USR issued violations to Swingset & Toy Warehouse for alleged violations of USR Code §150-20B, USR Code §150-20E, USR Code §150-20G, USR Code §150-20C, respectively. See attached respectively as Exhibits "L," "M," "N," and "O" are true and correct copies of case disposition information forms regarding complaint numbers SC-2010-9990, SC-2010-10021, SC-2010-10022, and SC-2010-10026, which alleged violations of USR Code §150-20B, USR Code §150-20E, USR Code §150-20G, USR Code §150-20C, respectively.
- 36. On March 16, 2011, via complaint number SC-2011-10339, USR issued a violation to Edyta Fromkin for an alleged violation of USR Code §150-37. See attached as **Exhibit "P"** is a true and correct copy of a case disposition information form regarding

complaint number SC-2011-10339, which alleged a violation of USR Code §150-37.

- 37. On November 19, 2013, via complaint number SC-2013-11496, USR issued a violation to Lizabeth Garcia for an alleged violation of USR Code §150-20G. See attached as Exhibit "Q" is a true and correct copy of a case disposition information form regarding complaint number SC-2013-11496, which alleged a violation of USR Code §150-20G.
- 38. On October 7, 2014, via complaint number SC-2014-11737, USR issued a violation to President Profess Baseball Ins. for an alleged violation of USR Code §150-37. See attached as Exhibit "R" is a true and correct copy of a case disposition information form regarding complaint number SC-2014-11738, which alleged a violation of USR Code §150-37.

USR'S REGULATION OF ITS UTILITY POLES

- 39. It has been the responsibility of USR's Police Department ("USR PD") and the Department of Public Works ("DPW") to enforce the prohibition by removing unauthorized signs, devices, or other matter placed on utility poles.
- 40. If a sign, device, or other matter that violated the law is within a USR PD officer's reach and can be safely removed by the officer, the unauthorized sign, device, or other matter would be removed by a USR PD officer without regard to the content of the unauthorized sign, device, or other matter.

- 41. If a sign, device, or other matter that violates the law is out of reach or affixed in a manner that prevents and officer from safely removing the unauthorized sign, device, other matter with his or her hands, then the officer would (1) notify the property owner and have the property owner remove the unauthorized sign, device, or other matter; (2) the DPW would be notified and a DPW staff member would be dispatched to remove the unauthorized sign, device, or other matter using a truck or other device that could safely reach the item. This is also done without regard to the content of the item.
- 42. If the owner of the removed sign, device, or other matter is clear from the face of the item removed, then the owner is notified that the unauthorized sign, device, or other matter is at the USR PD. However, if the owner fails to retrieve the unauthorized sign, device, or other matter it would be deposed of. I can remember numerous occasions when unauthorized signs, devices, or other matter that had been removed from USR utility poles were piled up behind the USR PD building, waiting to be picked up and disposed of by the DPW or retrieved by their owners.
- 43. USR has consistently enforced and continues to consistently enforce this prohibition, even against extensions or divisions of its own government.
- 44. For example, in or around 2013 or 2014, an employee of the USR Building Department caused the USR Fire Department's signs,

advertising its car show fundraiser, to be removed from utility poles because they violated local law.

- 45. As far back as approximately twenty years ago, I recall the Lion's Club located directly behind Borough Hall had its signs, advertising its carnival, removed from utility poles.
- 46. It has been my experience that USR has consistently enforced its policy and code provisions that prohibit the attachment of unauthorized signs, devices and other matter to utility poles. The only time I recall that the Borough at times could not keep up with the posting of unauthorized signs, devices, and other matter, despite the effort invested, was in the midst of the fair housing issues in 2014 and in or around late summer of 2015.
- 47. As Chief of Police, I consistently ensured my officers removed unauthorized signs, devices, or other matter from utility poles.
- 48. Since even before the codification of the prohibition, USR has consistently enforced the prohibition and intends to continue to do so.

PLAINTIFFS' CLAIMS

49. I have reviewed Plaintiffs' papers in support of their preliminary injunction motion. In those papers, Plaintiffs repeatedly refer to their need for the eruv to travel to synagogue, while pushing baby carriages and wheelchairs or carrying items

such as keys and umbrellas. Declaration of S. Moshe Pinkasovits,

14; Declaration of Chaim Beruer, 9; Declaration of Moses Berger,

4 - 5, and 7 - 9; Declaration of Sarah Berger, 4 - 5, and 7 - 9; Declaration of Tzvi Schonfeld, 4 - 5, and 7 - 9; Yisroel

Friedman, 9 4 - 5, and 7 - 9; Yosef Rosen, 9 4 - 5, and 7 - 9.

- 50. There are, however, no synagogues in USR. As a matter of common sense, Plaintiffs, all of whom live in New York, cannot travel through USR to get to synagogue.
- 51. Plaintiffs' First Amended Complaint erroneously alleges that Yosef Rosen's property, 26 Jean Lane, Monsey, New York, 10952, extends into USR. See Plaintiffs' First Amended Complaint, \$\bigsep\$ 37. In fact, no such property exists within USR.
- 52. On June 12, 2017, Vaad haEruv representatives came into USR and installed lechis on utility poles within USR.
- 53. The Vaad haEruv representatives did not have a permit to perform this work or the consent of USR to do. Based on my conversations with USR Code Official James Dougherty, I understand that Mr. Dougherty instructed the Vaad haEruv representatives to stop work while USR determined whether the Vaad haEruv could perform the installation of lechis consistent with local law and what type of consent the Vaad haEruv needed from USR to do so.
- 54. On June 15, 2017, Vaad haEruv representatives came to Borough Hall and spoke to Mr. Dougherty and USR's Part-Time Code Official, Steven Forbes. Based on my conversations with Mr.

Dougherty, I understand that during this conversation Mr. Dougherty excused himself, without stating where he was going and spoke to me about the eruv.

- 55. During my conversation with Mr. Dougherty, he explained that representatives of the Vaad haEruv were inquiring what had to be done for the Vaad haEruv to install lechis on utility poles and complete an eruv that would encompass portions of USR.
- 56. At the conclusion of my conversation with Mr. Dougherty, I advised Mr. Dougherty that he should refer the Vaad haEruv's representatives to the USR PD, as USR Code provides that USR PD was responsible for enforcing USR Code §122-17G. I now know, after further discussions with Mr. Dougherty, that he misunderstood me as suggesting the Vaad haEruv could proceed if the Vaad haEruv participated in a pre-construction meeting with the USR PD and complied with the traffic safety requirements identified by the USR PD.
- 57. Subsequently, I learned from the Borough Counsel that USR Code $\S122-17G$ and N.J.S.A. 48:3-19 require approval of the governing body before anything may be mounted to utility poles within the Borough.

THE AFFECTED POLES

58. I further learned of the large number of USR utility poles that are the subject of the eruv at issue in the above-captioned matter.

- 59. On October 19, 2017, at my instruction, Mr. Forbes conducted a survey of all utility poles on the streets impacted by the eruv (<u>i.e.</u>, West Saddle River Road, Old Stone Church Road, East Saddle River Road, Weiss Road, Sparrowbush Road, and Hillside Avenue). Declaration of Steven Forbes, Exhibit A.
- 60. Mr. Forbes memorialized his observations in a list that sets forth the date of inspection, whether the utility pole has lechis attached, the number of lechis on the utility pole, the location of the utility pole, the utility pole number and the utility pole sub-number ("Mr. Forbes' List"). Id.
- 61. Pursuant to Mr. Forbes' list, there are 109 utility poles with lechis within USR.
- 62. I have reviewed Exhibit G to the Declaration of Rabbi Chaim Steinmetz in Support of Plaintiffs' Motion for a Preliminary Injunction (hereafter, "Rabbi Steinmetz Ex. G").
- 63. Rabbi Steinmetz Ex. G reveals that the Vaad haEruv allegedly obtained a license from O & R for the installation of lechis on only 40 utility poles. Id.
- 64. Further, a review of O & R's location descriptions, confirming the locations using Mr. Forbes' list, reveals that only 36 of the utility poles listed in the O & R alleged license are within USR. Id.; Mr. Forbes' List.

- 65. More specifically, utility pole numbers 57170-38903, located at 194 Upper Saddle River Rd, and 57284-38918, located at 168 Upper Saddle River, are both within Montvale, New Jersey. Id.
- 66. I investigated the locations of utility pole numbers 57170-38903 and 57284-38918 and confirmed that they are <u>not</u> in USR and are instead in Montvale, New Jersey.
- 67. Additionally, utility pole numbers 57307-38025 and 57308-39035, are at 1019 Chestnut Ridge Rd in Chestnut Ridge, New York. Id.
- 68. Again, I personally investigated the locations of utility pole numbers 57307-38025 and 57308-39035 and confirmed that they are <u>not</u> within USR and are instead within Chestnut Ridge, New York.
- 69. I have reviewed the Declaration of David Gudino, Esq. ("Gudino Decl."), counsel for Verizon, and compared his certification to Mr. Forbes' list and Rabbi Steinmetz Ex. G.
- 70. All poles identified on Mr. Forbes' List are accurately identified in the Gudino Decl.
- 71. The vast majority of utility poles with lechis on Mr. Forbes' List that are not listed within the O & R license fall within the section of the eruv that the Plaintiffs consider "active."

- 72. Further, utility pole number 56438-39120 no longer exist, because Mr. Forbes was unable to locate it and memorialize its location on his list. Mr. Forbes' List; Rabbi Steinmetz Ex. G.
- 73. Additionally, utility pole number 56811-39010 no longer exists, because Mr. Forbes was unable to locate it and memorialize its location on his list. Mr. Forbes' List; Rabbi Steinmetz Ex. G.
- 74. All utility poles that have a sub-number are owned by Verizon. Gudino Decl., ightharpoonup 4.
- 75. When comparing Exhibit A of the Gudino Decl. to Mr. Forbes' List, I conclude that all poles on Mr. Forbes' List are subject to the Verizon Joint Use Agreement. See Gudino Decl., Exhibit A; Mr. Forbes' List. In other words, for Plaintiffs to have a "valid license" pertaining their use, Plaintiffs were required to obtain consent from both Verizon and O & R.
- 76. Further, all of the poles identified in Rabbi Steinmetz's Ex. G are also subject to the Verizon Joint Use Agreement. Id.; Gudino Decl., P 6.
- 77. Twenty-one of the utility poles allegedly "licensed" by O & R are owned by Verizon. Rabbi Steinmetz Ex. G; Gudino Decl.,

 ¶ 4.
- 78. It is curious that Plaintiffs allege that they have a valid license for an eruv but have failed to obtain a license from the utility pole owners and joint users of all of the utility poles in the "active" section of the eruv.

- 79. Plaintiffs have also failed to obtain the consent of Verizon, the joint user of all utility poles at issue and owner of most of the utility poles at issue in both the "active" and "inactive" sections of the eruv.
- 80. Additionally, it recently came to USR's attention that proper municipal consent was not obtained for the installation of a potentially dangerous ungrounded metal wire attached to the lechis and strung from utility pole to utility pole. Declaration of Patrick Rotella, \$\mathbb{P}\$ 38, \$\mathbb{P}\$ 45c. Further, I have learned that the lechis installed in USR are made of ungrounded PVC plumbing grade pipes. See Declaration of Steven Forbes, \$\mathbb{P}\$ 16. Utilizing PVC plumbing grade pipe does not conform to the pipes' intended uses. Id.
- 81. Lastly, neither Plaintiffs nor the Vaad haEruv have ever approached USR seeking a permit, variance, or waiver from the Mayor and Council to place lechis on utility poles.
- 82. Were the Plaintiffs to seek such a permit, variance, or waiver, the Mayor and Council would give it due consideration, as they are required to do by law.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true

and correct.

ORDINANCE NO. 17-94

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 150 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF UPPER SADDLE RIVER ENTITLED "ZONING".

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Bection 1.

Chapter 150 of the Code of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, Section 150-21, subsection A thereof, is hereby amended to read as follows:

- A. R-1 and R-2 Districts. The following provisions shall govern the placement of signs in the R-1 and R-2 Residence Districts:
- (1) One sign shall be permitted on any premises used for residential purposes. The total area of such sign shall not exceed twelve (12) square feet, and the height thereof shall not extend six (6) feet above the natural grade of the property.
- (2) Only freestanding signs shall be permitted and no sign shall be attached to a tree, pole, building or structure.
- (3) No sign shall be placed, located or displayed closer than eight (8) feet to any property line.
- (4) No sign shall be placed upon any roadway or public right-of-way.
- (5) A sign shall be placed at a location so as not to obscure the line of sight at intersections or points of access to the premises being served or adjacent premises.
- (6) No sign shall be, in whole or part, moving, mobile, flashing or revolving.
- (7) No sign shall be illuminated externally by any light source, including but not limited to floodlights, illuminated signs or gas-filled tubes.
- (8) No sign shall have more than (3) colors, inclusive of its background, frame and decorative parts. For the purpose of

this Ordinance, black and white shall be considered colors.

- (9) Any sign visible through a window on the interior of a premises and located within three (3) feet of such window shall be considered a sign for the purpose of this Ordinance.
- (10) The provisions and regulations of (1) through (8) above shall not apply to the following signs, which may be placed on premises in addition to the sign permitted in subsection A:
- (a) A nonilluminated or indirectly illuminated nonflashing sign or signs identifying the residence, the resident or residents or the street address, or any combination thereof, and no such sign shall have an area of more than one (1) square foot, nor shall the aggregate square footage of such signs, if there is more than one (1), exceed two (2) square feet in area.
- (b) Professional nameplates for premises containing an office as a lawful nonconforming use, which may in addition to the sign or signs permitted in (a) above, have one (1) nonilluminated or indirectly illuminated nonflashing professional announcement sign with an area of not over one (1) square foot.
- (c) Customary warning, trespassing and posted signs or sign indicating the private nature of a driveway or property, provided that the size of any such sign shall not exceed one (1) square foot.
- (d) Flags of the United States, State of New Jersey or other governmental or quasi-public agencies, or decorative or seasonal flags.
- (e) Holiday decorations and lights on residential premises.

Section 2.

Chapter 150 of the Code of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, Section 150-37, subsection B thereof, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"B. A permit shall be required for every sign and sign structure regulated by this chapter. Prior to issuing any permit required by this section, the Construction Code Official shall collect a fee which shall be in accordance with the provisions set forth in Section 41-8 of the Borough Code."

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Section 3. Severability.

If any section, sentence or any other part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not effect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance but shall be confined in its effect to the section, sentence or other part of this Ordinance directly involved in the controversy which such judgment shall be rendered.

Section 4. Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed.

All ordinances or parts or ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

Chapter 150. Zoning

Article I. General Provisions

§ 150-3. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

ACCESSORY

A building or use which is clearly incidental or subordinate to the principal building or use and located on the same lot with such principal building or use. Any accessory building attached to a principal building is deemed to be part of the principal building in applying the bulk regulations to accessory buildings.

AREA OF SIGN

The surface area computed by drawing a rectangle touching the outermost edges of letters comprising the sign, or the area established by reason of distinctive variation in background color, by borders or by some other equivalent manner, whichever is greater.

[Amended 11-14-1985]

BERM

A quantity of dirt, stone, fill or other suitable material or combinations of material, which is mounded up by a property owner.

[Added 9-13-1990 by Ord. No. 18-90]

BILLBOARD

An outdoor signboard or surface used for announcements, advertising posters or sign purposes. [Amended 11-14-1985]

BUFFER

A portion of a lot along its front, rear or side lot line which contains only landscaping elements and does not contain any building, parking area or driveway, except that a front buffer may contain one or more driveways connecting the lot with the street, provided that such driveways are substantially perpendicular to the front lot line.

[Added 7-12-1984]

BUILDING

Any combination of materials forming a construction. The term "building" is not intended to include underground construction which permits the use of the ground above as if no construction existed. The term "building" shall include the term "structure" as well as the following:

- A. Signs.
- B. Fences.
- C. Walls, except retaining walls projecting above the ground not more than three feet at the higher ground level and not more than 6 1/2 feet at the lower ground level.
- D. Radio and television antennas, except for such antennas installed on the roof of a building and extending not more than 15 feet above the highest level of the roof of such building.

E. Porches, carports and other similar structures.

BUILDING, COMPLETELY ENCLOSED

A building separated on all sides from the adjacent open space or from other buildings or other structures by a permanent roof and by exterior walls or party walls pierced only by windows or normal entrance or exit doors.

BUILDING COVERAGE

The percentage of lot area which is improved with the principal building and any accessory buildings. Roofs, porches or similar extensions of any building shall be included as part of the building coverage. Any eave or similar projection shall be considered a part of the building for the computation of building coverage and the distance to the property line.

[Added 9-10-1981; amended 12-28-1995 by Ord. No. 20-95]

BUILDING, DETACHED

A building surrounded by open space on the same lot.

BUS

A vehicle accommodating nine or more passengers and not classified as a station wagon by the manufacturer.

COMMON OWNERSHIP

Ownership of two or more contiguous parcels of real property by one person or by two or more persons owning such property jointly as tenants by the entirety or as tenants in common.

DWELLING, ONE-FAMILY

A detached building containing one dwelling unit only.

DWELLING UNIT

A building or entirely self-contained portion thereof containing complete housekeeping facilities for only one family, including any domestic servants employed on the premises, and having no enclosed space (other than vestibules, entranceways or other hallways or porches) or cooking or sanitary facilities in common with any other dwelling unit. A boarding- or rooming house, house trailer or other similar structures or vehicles shall not be deemed to constitute a dwelling unit.

EARTH STATION ANTENNA (receiver only)

An antenna, usually a dish antenna, whose purpose it is to receive television signals. [Added 8-11-1983]

EQUIPMENT, COMMERCIAL

Any equipment such as log splitters, wood chippers, cement mixers, bulldozers, track diggers, surface graders, payloaders, landscaping and farm tractors or any other like equipment, either transported on trailer or under its own power. Expressly excluded from the meaning of this term are the typical homeowner lawn mower, lawn and garden tractor with trailer, snowplow or blower or similar equipment.

[Added 10-12-1994 by Ord. No. 15-94]

FAMILY

Any number of persons, related or not, living together as a single housekeeping unit. [Amended 5-8-1986 by Ord. No. 8-86]

FLOOR AREA RATIO (FAR)

The ratio, expressed as a percent, of total floor area to total lot area. [Added 9-10-1981]

HEIGHT

The vertical distance measured from the lowest exposed or adjacent grade of the building to the highest level of the roof, regardless of the type of roof, measured from natural grade.

[Amended 4-10-1996 by Ord. No. 1-96; 4-10-1999 by Ord. No. 3-99; 5-10-2000 by Ord. No. 5-00]

HOTEL

A single building used in the business of furnishing sleeping and eating accommodations to the general public of at least two separate stories above ground level, containing:

[Added 7-12-1984]

- A. At least 60 sleeping rooms, exclusive of public rooms and bathrooms.
- B. At least one restaurant within the building.
- C. A central entrance leading to a common lobby area, which lobby area shall contain the registration and service desk, which service desk shall be manned 24 hours a day.
- Sleeping rooms no less than 375 square feet in area, including closets and bathroom area.

IMPROVEMENT COVERAGE

The area on and under the ground, expressed as a percent of total lot area, which is occupied or covered with the principal and accessory buildings and all other improvements on or to the land, including but not limited to parking areas, driveways, tennis courts, curbing, sidewalks, walkways, lot entranceways, patios, swimming pools, decks, signs, pads for air conditioning, lighting or other equipment, retention and detention basins of pervious and impervious surfaces and any other hard surface, whether or not paved by way of macadam, concrete, bricks or other types of paving stones or blocks or surfaced with stones or gravel. Excluded from this definition shall be retention and detention basins that are constructed of natural materials, sewer, drainage and utility lines, underground storage tanks, sculpture, fountains or other artworks or ponds that are designed either to be kept filled with water or to be kept landscaped when dry. [Added 9-10-1981; amended 12-28-1995 by Ord. No. 20-95]

LIGHT MANUFACTURING

The shaping, assembly and treatment of previously processed raw materials by manual or machine operation, provided that any such use shall not:

[Added 7-12-1984]

- A. Violate the performance standards or requirements of this chapter or any other ordinance of the Borough.
- B. Be a use expressly prohibited by this chapter.

LIVABLE FLOOR AREA

The floor area of a dwelling, excluding basements, cellars, rooms for heating equipment, garages and unenclosed porches, breezeways and other unheated areas, and including only such floor area under a sloping ceiling for which the headroom is not less than five feet six inches and then only if at least 75% of such floor area has a ceiling height of not less than seven feet six inches and if any such floor that is situated above another story has access to the floor below by a permanent built-in stairway.

LOT

A parcel of land, exclusive of any adjoining street, the location, dimensions and boundary of which are determined by description, as on a subdivision map of record or an official map, or by metes and bounds, which is occupied or intended to be occupied by one building and, if any, its accessory buildings, or by a group of buildings as permitted by this chapter, and including such open spaces appurtenant to such building or group of buildings as are required by this chapter.

A. LOT, CORNER

A lot at the junction of and abutting on two or more intersecting streets where the interior angle of intersection does not exceed 135°. A lot abutting a curved street shall be deemed a corner lot if the tangents to the curve at the points of intersection of the side lot lines with the street lines intersect on an interior angle of less than 135°.

B. LOT, DEPTH OF

The mean perpendicular distance between the front and rear lot lines.

C. LOT, WIDTH OF

The distance between the side lot lines measured along the front setback line regardless of where a structure is located or proposed to be located.

[Amended 8-9-1979]

D. LOT FRONTAGE

The distance between the side lot lines measured along a street lot line, which shall be no less than 25 feet from the center line of a street other than State Highway Route 17 and no less than 60 feet from the center line of Route 17. If any street is required by any governmental authority to have a width greater than set forth herein, then, for purposes of this definition, the street lot line shall be the boundary between the lot and the street as fixed by such governmental authority. [Added 8-9-1979]

MOTEL

Any building or group of buildings used in the business of furnishing sleeping accommodations to the public, other than a hotel as defined herein.

[Added 7-12-1985]

MULTIFAMILY DWELLING

A building designed or intended to contain three or more dwelling units located above, below or to the side of each other, and which may share common facilities, such as entryways, hallways and utility systems. This term may include apartments, condominiums, and cooperatives.

[Added 2-5-2015 by Ord. No. 1-15]

NONCONFORMING BUILDING OR USE

A building or use that does not conform to the regulations prescribed for the zone in which it is situated.

NONCONFORMING LOT

A lot or parcel which does not have the minimum width, depth or contain the minimum area for the district in which it is located.

OFFICE BUILDING

A building used primarily for business offices or where the major use is business offices as opposed to retail, warehouse, residential or manufacturing use.

[Added 11-14-1985]

PARKING BAY

The parking unit comprising an aisle and the one or two rows of stalls served by it.

PRIVATE SWIMMING POOL

Includes any artificially constructed swimming pool or tank established or maintained upon any premises by any individual for his own or his family's use or for the use of guests of his household which has a capacity for water depth of more than 24 inches and whether maintained above the ground or below ground level.

SETBACK

A specified distance from a lot line within which a building may not extend, except that all street lot line setback measurements are to commence 25 feet from the center line of the street or streets, except on State Highway Route 17, where all highway lot line setback measurements shall commence 60 feet from the center line of the highway.

SIGN

Any inscription written, printed, painted or otherwise placed on a board, plate, banner or upon any material object or any device whatsoever which, by reason of its form, color, wording, activity or technique or otherwise, attracts attention to itself, used as a means of identification, advertisement or announcement. As used in this chapter, the term shall apply only to such signs as are visible to persons located outdoors. [Amended 11-14-1985]

SINGLE OWNERSHIP

Ownership by one person or by two or more persons, whether jointly, as tenants by the entirety or as tenants in common, of a separate parcel of real property.

STORY

That portion of a building between the surface of any floor and the surface of the floor above it, or if there is no floor above it, then the space between the surface of the floor and the ceiling above it. [Added 5-10-2000 by Ord. No. 5-00]

STORY, FIRST

The lowest story of the ground story of any building, the floor of which is not more than 12 inches below the ground level of the exterior walls of the building.

[Added 5-10-2000 by Ord. No. 5-00]

STORY, HALF

A partial story under a gable, hip or gambrel roof, the wall plates of which on at least two opposite exterior walls are not more than four feet above the floor of such story.

[Added 5-10-2000 by Ord. No. 5-00]

TRAILER, HOUSE; MOTOR HOME; CAMPER; CAMPING VEHICLE; and CAMPING TRAILER

Any vehicle used or intended to be used as a conveyance upon the public streets or highways, whether or not licensed as such, and includes self-propelled and non-self-propelled vehicles, as designed, constructed, reconstructed or added to by means of accessories in such a manner as to permit the occupancy thereof as a dwelling or sleeping place for one or more persons and having no foundation other than wheels, jacks or blocks.

[Amended 2-8-1973]

VEHICLE, COMMERCIAL

Any motor vehicle or trailer displaying commercial registration plates, or any motor vehicle or trailer having any permanent or temporary name, logo or other symbol applied to the vehicle which identifies it as a business or any attachment such as a toolbox, pipe rack, lumber rack, liftgate, snowplow and/or associated hydraulics, or any other accessory equipment that may indicate in any way that the vehicle is being used for purposes other than personal nonbusiness transportation.

[Added 10-12-1994 by Ord. No. 15-94]

WADING POOL

Any artificially constructed pool or tank which has the capacity for water depth of 24 inches or less and whether maintained above the ground or below the ground level.

YARD

A. YARD, FRONT

An unoccupied ground area fully open to the sky between the street line and a line parallel thereto, termed the setback line.

B. YARD, REAR

An unoccupied ground area fully open to the sky between the rear lot line and a line drawn parallel thereto.

C. YARD, SIDE

An unoccupied ground area fully open to the sky between any property line other than a street or rear lot line and a line drawn parallel thereto and between the front and rear yards.

ORDINANCE #19-95

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 76 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF UPPER SADDLE RIVER, NEW JERSEY, ENTITLED "LICENSES".

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows;

Section 1. Chapter 76 of the Code of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, Article V, Sectio 76-46, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 76-46: Signs: The following shall be the sole signs permitted in connection with garage sales:

- (A) One (1) on-premises sign not exceeding three (3) square feet in area posted only on the scheduled sale days, which sign shall be removed immediately after the sale has been concluded.
- (B) Two (2) off-premises signs may be posted on a municipal right-of-way, and not on private property, provided that such sign shall be freestanding and shall not exceed three (3) square feet in area which signs shall be removed within 24 hours after the sale has been concluded.
- (C) Name and address of licensee shall be posted on the sign.
- (D) No signs shall be permitted to be posted on such structures as telephone poles, street signs, trees or fences.

Section 3.

Section 76-49; Violation and Penalties: Except as otherwise provided in this Article, any person who violates or refuses to comply with this Article shall be liable to a penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100) for each offense.

Section 4. Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed:
All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 5. Effective Date: This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

The above ordinance was introduced at a Regular meeting of the Mayor and Council on November 8, 1995 and passed its first reading and will be considere for final passage at a meeting of the said Mayor and Council to be held on December 13, 1995 at 8:00 P.M. at the Borough Hall, Upper Saddle River, at which time and place all persons interested therein will be given an opportunity to be heard concerning same.

ORDINANCE #16-15_

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 122 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF UPPER SADDLE RIVER ENTITLED, "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS".

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, in the County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1.

Chapter 122 of the Code of the Borough of Upper Saddle River, Streets and Sidewalks, Article III, Borough Road Regulations, §122-17, Unlawful Acts, be and is hereby amended to add the following paragraph:

"G. Post or affix any sign, advertisement, notice, poster, paper, device, or other matter to any public utility pole, shade tree, lamp post, curbstone, sidewalk, or upon any public structure or building, except as may be authorized or required by law."

Section 2. Fines and Penalties.

For violation of any provision of this Ordinance, the fines and penalties shall be in accordance with §1-15 of the Borough Code.

Section 3. Severability.

If any section, sentence or any other part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not effect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance but shall be confined in its effect to the section, sentence or other pat of this Ordinance directly involved in the

controversy which such judgment shall be rendered.

Section 4. Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed.

All ordinances or parts or ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect after publication thereof and final passage as required by law.

My apologies for disrupting you day yesterday.

I wanted you to know that;

- Vaad is a contractor that is installing ERUV on utility poles within the Borough of Upper Saddle River.
- Federal Government requires the Utility Company to have a procedure, along with an
 applications process and required fees for any and all pole attachments, much like Fire
 Sirens, Telephone and Cable attachments and similarly for Flags, Vertical Banners and
 Holiday decoration attachments.
- Customers in the area were quite flustered and wanted some answers.

Attached you will find USR Ordinance regarding affixing to Public Utility poles... Letter G., that states; except as may be authorized or required by law.

In short, I highly recommend that the Borough of Upper Saddle River have a discussion with the Borough of <u>Tenafly</u> prior to taking any action. (in the Tenafly case that went to Federal court, the Borough lost. There are a few other out there as well, like Westhampton Beach and Teaneck)

I have dealt with various NJ Bergen municipalities such as, Montvale, Mahwah and now Upper Saddle River, on this same issue and as a regulated utility company government by the BPU and the Federal government, RECO must abide by the rules and allow attachments for all entities/businesses that follow the procedure, apply and pay fees for space use on a utility pole.

Below is some information that I wanted to share with you, for your use, not for public distribution at this time...

Eruv in brief

What does this eruy look like?

This eruv is a narrow strip of white plastic conduit 1 inch wide and 14 to 22 feet long that runs vertically attached to the side of certain utility poles.

Why does O&R permit eruvs on its utility poles?

Our practice is consistent with federal and New York state laws governing utility pole attachments in the broad sense, and required based upon a number of court rulings pertaining to eruvs in the specific sense.

What do the court rulings say?

Both federal and state courts have been consistently supportive of the legality of eruv attachments. The courts have ruled that, because a wide variety of attachments are already legally allowed to be mounted on utility poles, the eruv cannot be excluded. The courts classify the eruv as a pole attachment and that's how O&R is required to treat the eruv.

Does the "separation of church and state" doctrine apply here?

It does not. O&R is a private company rather than a government organization. Therefore, the doctrine of "separation of church and state" does not apply.

How do O&R's regulators view this issue?

Federal and New York state laws dating back to 1978 have set forth requirements governing attachments to utility poles.

Though originally addressing the then-new cable television industry in those requirements, as the uses for the utility pole's space grew, state and federal regulators permitted other attachments on the poles.

What are some of those other attachments?

Some of the other attachments, in addition to the eruv, are telecommunications fiber optic cable, security cameras, license plate readers, small cell antennas and automated metering devices. Under the regulations, those uses, terms and charges are established by agreement of the utility pole owner and the entity seeking to attach to the pole.

Is there a stated policy and process for this work?

Yes. A description of the requirements is in O&R's Pole Attachment Policy. Under this policy, all attachees must go through a process which provides for an application and fee, licensing agreements, insurance requirements, surveys, and inspections by O&R before and after the installation.

Is there a charge for this work?

Yes. O&R uses the same formula to compute the annual charge for each pole attachment under this policy.

How many entities have attachments on O&R poles?

In 2016, O&R has contracts for pole attachments under this policy with 69 cable and telecommunications companies, and a number of other public and private entities. Also, 18 municipalities have contracts with O&R that permit holiday lighting installations on poles. Those charges are determined through a flat, kilowatt-hour usage fee.

Is the eruv unique to the O&R service area?

No. Approximately thirty of the 50 United States have at least one eruv.

There are approximately 50 recorded eruv installations in New York State and 22 in New Jersey.

All of downtown Washington, D.C., including the National Mall, memorials, the White House, the Capitol, the Smithsonian museums and the National Gallery, is located within an eruy.

Chapter 122. Streets and Sidewalks Article III. Borough Road Regulations § 122-17. Unlawful acts.

It shall be unlawful to:

- A. Cast, throw or spill dirt, sand, ashes, gravel, brick, stones, wastepaper, lumber or other similar loose material on a Borough road.
- B. Mix dry or wet concrete, cement or plaster of any kind or description on the surface of a Borough road.
- C. Spill turpentine, kerosene, gasoline, petroleum, lubricating oil or other highly flammable oils or their volatile products, or allow such fluids to escape, on the surface of a Borough road; or operate a tank truck or other vehicle from which fluids are permitted to escape.
- D. Flush or cause to be drained or pumped to the surface of a Borough road wastewater or fluid of any kind.
- E. Place or cause to be placed on a Borough road a permanent or temporary obstruction of any kind.
- F. Burn leaves or any other material on a Borough road which may cause sufficient heat to affect asphalt pavement. [1]
 - [1] Editor's Note: Former Subsection G, regarding throwing snow or ice on plowed roads, which immediately followed this subsection, was repealed 4-10-1996 by Ord. No. 2-96. See now § 122-17.1, Snow and ice removal; prohibited acts.
- G. Post or affix any sign, advertisement, notice, poster, paper, device, or other matter to any public utility pole, shade tree, lamp post, curbstone, sidewalk, or upon any public structure or building, except as may be authorized or required by law.

O&R TO POLITICAL CANDIDATES: POST NO SIGNS ON UTILITY POLES

PEARL RIVER, NY Sept. 29, 2015 ---Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. today issued a reminder to all political candidates and their campaign workers about O&R's long-standing policy prohibiting the posting of all signs on utility poles.

This policy is grounded in very practical safety and litter control considerations and O&R is asking the cooperation of political campaigns for compliance.

Before anyone ever imagined the Internet, one of the most popular local message boards by default became the utility poles that line many of the community's streets. The poles were one of the most convenient and accessible methods for hosting a posting. Signs of every shape, size and message sprung up every political season.

Unfortunately, those signs and posters usually are affixed to the poles with staples, tacks or nails, which present a potential hazard to O&R employees working on the poles.

Further, such signs can obscure the pole's 10-digit I.D. number, hindering customer efforts to determine a definitive pole location when reporting outages or damage.

In addition, signs on poles may impair sight lines at intersections, or otherwise present a visual distraction to motorists. And, once the campaigns have taken place, the outdated signs remain as an eyesore and eventually a litter nuisance.

Chapter 122. Streets and Sidewalks Article III. Borough Road Regulations

It shall be unlawful to:

§ 122-17. Unlawful acts.

- A. Cast, throw or spill dirt, sand, ashes, gravel, brick, stones, wastepaper, lumber or other similar loose material on a Borough road.
- B. Mix dry or wet concrete, cement or plaster of any kind or description on the surface of a Borough road.
- C. Spill turpentine, kerosene, gasoline, petroleum, lubricating oil or other highly flammable oils or their volatile products, or allow such fluids to escape, on the surface of a Borough road; or operate a tank truck or other vehicle from which fluids are permitted to escape.
- D. Flush or cause to be drained or pumped to the surface of a Borough road wastewater or fluid of any kind.
- E. Place or cause to be placed on a Borough road a permanent or temporary obstruction of any kind.
- F. Burn leaves or any other material on a Borough road which may cause sufficient heat to affect asphalt pavement.^[1]





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
